A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Friends,

Growing up in New England, during the winter months my father taught me to keep a blanket, a coffee can, a candle, a collapsible shovel, and a bag of kitty litter in the trunk of my car in case I ever got stuck in snow. I've learned some more things to keep in the care in case of emergencies; potatoes. There are three uses for potatoes.

- 1. On rainy days, water easily accumulates on the side view mirrors of your car which effects the vision and can be very dangerous. Slice a potato open and slide it back and forth over the mirror two times. Rinse the mirror and the water will be gone and will not accumulate again!
- 2. The metal parts on the front of your car are prone to rust in time and the rust cannot be wiped off. All you need to do is to slice a potato and slide it back and forth over the rusty area and then rinse it with water and the rest will be one!

I'm just one of those "geeks" that likes to look up handy helpful tips and the internet has made this a very simple pastime!

Now, I do have some helpful things in the back of my car but no potatoes. This is new discovery (the potatoes) but this reminded me of

how helpful ordinary things can be. I can think of many things to do with a potato in the culinary world but not in the automobile detailing world.

This may seem strange but when I stumbled across this story about potatoes and cars it did make me think about how everything in God's creation was put here for a purpose and as time goes on, we discover more purposes. We were eating potatoes long before we discovered that we could use them to replace our squeegees and shammies!

I don't think God create potatoes to take care of our cars but isn't it interesting that one of His creations has purposes that we had never imagined? I think that is how creation work. In creation are the answers to all of our needs.

Good Friday Prayer Vigil

APRIL 7, 6 PM—12 AM

Objective: The intention is to draw us individually and collectively closer to the Lord, to share a common experience as congregation, and to create an unbroken prayer chain that binds us together as worshippers.

When: The vigil with go from 6:00 p.m. to 12:00 midnight. Member of our congregation to each take a 15-minute period of time to pray, holding silent vigil until the next person's time.

Where: Participants can pray in the sanctuary, or from home. Those who feel called to pray at church, whether for 15 minutes or even all evening, are welcome to come by the church. There will be individuals present to open and close the church and to simply be present to support the you during your prayer time. It is fine of more than one person signs up for the same prayer time.

Prayer Focus: There will be no formal materials or format involved. The intention is to be spiritually simple before the Lord Jesus, thanking Him for dying on the Cross for us, as we fill our minds and hearts with Holy Scriptures, prayers or hymn verses to be lifted up to Him from the Bible or related sacred texts. Please do consider participating, and, if you cannot or choose not to formally sign up, please join us in prayer and meditation during the 6-hour period. The event will be streaming live on YouTube.

FAMILY FUN TIME

Bring the kids for fun & games & snacks, too!



Use batik, a unique fabric-dying method, to create flags celebrating the good news of Christ's resurrection.



What you need:

- Colored chalk
- · White linen fabric
- Washable gel glue
- Acrylic craft paint
- Textile medium
- · Paintbrushes

What you do:

- 1. Cut fabric to the desired size and shape. Set it on a flat, protected surface. With chalk, lightly sketch an Easter design or message.
- Completely cover the chalk lines with gel glue. Let dry.
- Mix equal parts paint and textile medium. Paint the flag with that mixture, which makes paint permanent. Let dry.
- Soak the dried fabric in warm water a few minutes. Then gently peel away the glue to reveal the unpainted areas. Lay flat to dry.
- 5. Hang the flags and celebrate!




SEEING AND BELIEVING
