Mission News for October TREX Bench- Plastic Recycling

As of mid-September, the members of Faith have collected **256 pounds** of plastic. We are **just over half-way** to our goal of 500 pounds! We have 3 months to bring in the remaining 244 pounds. That's an average of 80+ pounds a month. Keep up the good work and keep that plastic coming in. Ask friends, family and neighbors if they would be willing to donate their plastic to our mission.

Please remember it must be soft plastic that **you can push your thumb through**. If it's labeled with 2 or 4 it is acceptable. It also must be clean and dry. Cereal box bags are acceptable as long as the **crumbs are dumped out.**



We're on our way to earning Bench #3!

The picture on this page shows 6 very large bags of plastic. **That amount weighs only 68 pounds.** We need to fill 7-8 of those bags every month for the next 3 months.

The new daycare is up and running! **Future Child Stars** will be holding classes Monday through Friday from 6 am—6 pm. During this time the daycare will keep the Sunday School Wing locked for the safety of the children.

BEYOND BORDERS FAMILY SPONSORSHIP

We recently learned that all 3 of our sponsored families have graduated from the program and are well on their way to becoming successful business women. All of their children are attending school and are receiving at least 1 nourishing meal at home each day. Soon we will be receiving more information on the families and will be sharing that with you.

Many thanks to all of the Faith family sponsors. You have truly made a huge difference in the lives of these families. They no longer suffer from ultra-poverty.

There are some major changes that will be made for the next cohort. The cohort will last 24 months instead of just 18. The cost will also be increasing from \$1,800 to \$2,400. Just like everywhere else inflation is affecting their expenses.

The Mission Team has made the decision to sponsor another family. We are hoping that with your help we can sponsor many more families once again. Information on how you can help sponsor will be forthcoming. In the past, several families and individuals have joined together to sponsor 1 family.

NEIGHBORS IN NEED

During the months of September and October Faith Church will be collecting the annual **Neighbors in Need Offering.** This offering is one of the special UCC missions collected throughout the year. This mission supports **ministries of justice** and compassion the US.

OR If you wish to make a kit or 2 these are the items that should be included.

One hand towel measuring approximately 15" x 28" to 16" x 32" (no fingertip, bath, dish towel or micro-fiber)

One washcloth

One wide-tooth comb removed from the package

Must be sturdy with at least 6 inches of teeth

No pocket combs or picks

Rattail and combs without handles are acceptable

One fingernail or toenail clipper removed from the package (either one is acceptable)

One bath-size bar of soap in the original package

One toothbrush in the original package

Ten standard size Band-Aids

All items need to fit inside a one-gallon Ziploc type bag. Remove the excess air from the bag and seal before boxing.
