Dear Friends,

There is no surprise in recognizing that attendance and participation in worship and church functions are declining over the years and certainly since the COVID pandemic. Your Consistory has been having a variety of conversations about addressing these realities.

I personally have done a lot of reading and research about church attendance across the denomination and throughout the country and participation among younger adults. While this is not true of every young adult, many are not interested in the traditional church programs. They are not moved by traditional hymns, organ music, or choir anthems. They are not even interested in Sunday School. They are not interested in finding a place to "belong." They have found this need in community organizations. If they do have children their children's activities and organizations (sports, dance, scouts) have taken up all of their time and energy to "belong."

Not looking for more places to "belong," they are moved by **<u>causes</u>** to support.

A Pew Research Poll showed that many millennials are turned off by the church because they perceive it as being:

- b. Overly concerned about money
- c. Ineffective in helping the poor
- d. Not caring enough about the environment

At the first meeting the Justice Committee chose to tackle two issues for now:

- a. Increase Faith Church's visibility in the Community as an Open and Affirming Congregation. A new banner and frame has been purchased for the front of the church although it has not been set up yet.
- b. To continue planting native plants which are beneficial to the environment on church property.

The Committee felt that this addressed items A and D in their charge.

So, we are doing what we can to make our church more relevant to items that matter the most to a younger generation. It means that the future of the church will look different but it is not bleak. You are welcome to join the Justice Committee in their work! We hope this will be many new adventures as we re-define what it means to be God's Community.

CONFIRMATION IS COMING!

Another Class of Confirmands is about to begin this fall. Things have changed a bit and will continue to change as to how the Confirmation Program will take place.

What will not change is that Confirmation is a two-year program, students must be in the 7th grade to begin, and the Rite of Confirmation will take place on Pentecost Sunday in the Confirmands second year. Also, what will not change is that students will have a mentor during their second year to coach them to design and execute a Confirmation Project.

What will change is that rather than having a Sunday morning class during their first year the students will have a monthly class on Sunday evenings. Students will be required to attend weekly worship.

What you need:

- 12 small, smooth rocks
- An empty, clean egg carton
- Paintbrush
- Acrylic paint (gold or silver)
- Black permanent marker

What you do:

- Clean the rocks and egg carton. Place newspaper on a table to protect it from paint.
- 2. Paint all sides of the rocks and carton. Let dry. Add a second coat, if desired.
- When rocks are dry, number each rock (1-12) with marker. Place rocks in the carton.
- Play hide-and-seek with a friend. Take turns hiding the rocks in a room, sandbox or backyard. Give clues, if needed, and count the rocks as they're returned.
- 5. Use your imagination to incorporate a treasure hunt into study time or family devotions.
