We're about to enter November; the first month of three in which we celebrate three of the biggest holidays of the year; Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Years. November is Thanksgiving.

What we once thought was essential to make a church relevant, vibrant, exciting, and a meaningful community has changed. It has changed because the world has changed and the church must change with it. Please consider this: Why should the church focus so much energy on programs that were so exciting in the past that people seem to have little interest in the present? The church cannot compete with programs in the community that people have decided are more meaningful or important to their lives. So, let's stop competing and learn how to do ministry differently.

I'm still mulling over the information that was shared with me on Ministry Day and in time I will share it with you at committee meetings and through these articles but perhaps the bottom line is the church must take a hard look at who is living in our neighborhood and what will meet their needs. Maybe it's not traditional things like a Sunday School, a youth group, a choir, organ music, or even church weddings. Maybe it's a way to engage in mission. We have a lot to figure out — like it or not, our community has changed.



Once again, we are offering the Children and Communion Program for children in grades 2 and above.



I hope you have all been enjoying our pollinator gardens this past spring, summer and fall. (Thanks again for those who've helped water and weed.) I have exciting news about our next native plant project a Native Plant Demonstration Garden! Over the next year we hope to transform the grassy area between the side door to the sanctuary and

the parking lot into a Native Plant Demonstration Garden. With a generous donation from the Memorial and Enduring Gifts Fund in memory of Evelyn Hovis we will begin Stage 1 in early November. The landscaper from Edge of the Woods Native Plant Nursery will be planting 3 new trees during the week of November 6th (weather permitting.) Stage 2 will be preparing the site for spring planting by employing sheet mulching this fall once the trees are in place. Stage 3 will be planting native trees and shrubs in the spring. We have applied for a grant from the Penn Northeast Conference to fund Stage 3. We won't know the exact amount of the grant we will receive until after their October 25th meeting. However, if we employ sheet mulching instead of having the landscaper remove the grass we can save a substantial amount of money and demonstrate how to transform our own lawns into gardens!

We need your help to collect and save newspaper, (free of glossy inserts and magazines) large pieces of brown cardboard (free of staples and tape), leaves, leaf mulch and compost to use once the landscaper has planted the trees early next month. If you are interested, please plan on joining us for the "Sheet Mulching Party" November 12<sup>th</sup> or 19<sup>th</sup>. During this event we will lay down the cardboard, wet it and top it with leaves, leaf mulch and compost. 

Handicrafts can spark appreciation for simple items. Weave this basket as a gift.



#### What you need:

- Paper plate
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Yarn (different colors)

#### What you do:

- In the center of the plate, trace something round. Draw 9 lines (evenly spaced) from the circle to the plate's edge.
- 2. Cut along each line, stopping at the center circle. Trim more of the plate off so the cuts make a gradual V shape.
- 3. Fold the plate's sides upward to form basket sides. Keep these upright as you weave a bowl-shaped basket.
- Begin weaving a length of yarn at the circle's base. Hold the end of the yarn in place as you spread the length over and under each side of the plate.
- Switch colors to make a pattern. Keep the yarn tight as you weave up the sides.
- 6. To finish, bend down any remaining paper. Leave a tail of yarn and tuck it under a woven portion. Share your craft with a friend!
