

Dear Friends,

We are coming out a "loud season," Advent. And loud it should be! After all Advent, while a season of preparation, is a celebration of the greatest event of all! The arrival of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love into a dark and agonizing world.

Now we enter Lent (slightly earlier this year than usual) which is more of a quiet, if not silent, season of the church year. I found a statement of faith about lent not that long ago entitled *Silence* by Liz Frenz that I would like to share with you.

Into the silence of the void the Creator spoke, and the world came into being. The Word of God in the vastness brought light from darkness, matter from nothing, flesh from dust, life from lifelessness.

In the quiet of a small town in Palestine the Word of God came to us. Even though of one being with the Creator, Jesus our Christ, taking on human form, was born, lived and walked among us, speaking the words of life. He was crucified, died, and was buried. He rose from the dead and speaks to us today. He is the one who saves us from ourselves.

In the stillness of our souls the Spirit of God, who is one with the Creator and the Christ, whispers the Word, and calls us back to the Creator, back to the Christ, back to the wholeness of everlasting life in the unity of the Creator, Christ and Spirit.

Silence, darkness, dust, lifelessness, quiet, whispers ... all of these, and other words in this creed, reflect the purpose of this season which is to reflect upon the presence of Christ in our lives.

There are many Lenten Disciplines that we practice—fasting, prayer, study, etc. Perhaps this year we can try practicing some silence. I will be the first one to say that I have a hard time practicing silence. I am not always comfortable in a quiet room so I will make noise myself which is not always helpful! But when I can be silent, I hear new voices and new words and a new message from God.

This Lent practice some silence and listen the voices speaking to you.

"But to know that through our commitment to this ministry that these blankets are going to be a place to offer comfort and security to those who may not have a safe place to live or to sleep, is truly a privilege."

Joanna is leaving a legacy of compassion and generosity that her sons will follow.

"As people of faith, we need to look out for others when we see people in need." Malcolm said. "[It] can go a long way in helping

CROSS OF ASHES — On Ash Wednesday, as Lent begins, worshipers' foreheads are often marked with ashes in the sign of the cross. The ashes traditionally come from burning palm branches from the previous Palm Sunday. In the Old Testament, ashes were a

sign of mourning and repentance. Today, some worshipers wipe off the ashes before leaving church, to symbolize being cleansed from sin by Jesus' death; others wear the ashes the rest of the day, carrying the cross of Christ into the world. Reciting Genesis 3:19 often accompanies the placement of ashes: "You are dust, and to dust you shall return."
