A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

Pennsylvania Avenue in Bethlehem is a lovely place to live.



Two wide lanes, beautiful trees, wonderful neighbors, close to shopping, schools and parks. What more could you ask for?

Well, traffic safety has been an issue. With two wide lanes like that people drive higher than the 35-mph speed limit and treat it like a four-lane highway. As a result, things like this have happened:







Between ourselves and our neighbors, 6 cars had been totaled and that doesn't count the cars driven by the drivers who hit our cars. What to do, what to do?

In 2017 Patience and I went to the Traffic Safety Office to share our concern. They agreed to do a "Traffic Study", whatever that is. After that was done they told us that the average speed of vehicles on Pennsylvania Avenue was between 35 and 40 MPH and since the speed limit was 35 MPH they didn't see the need to take any action. We went back and said that the real danger was people driving like it was a four-lane highway. Believing that this would resolve the issue or just satisfy us they put up a few "No Passing" signs. They failed to

change the behavior of motorists.

After more car crashes, in 2022 we went back but this time to City Counsil with 5 neighbors. We had noticed that on Eaton Avenue, a street similar in size, the city had painted white lines on the road to distinguish between driving areas and parking areas.





Surely, the city officials would see the wisdom in this. We weren't asking for the moon. No more signs, no traffic lights, no speed bumps ... just a white line.

I offered to pay for the paint! They promised to look into it but nothing but "radio silence."

Then this year, after two more crashes into cars that were legally parked we went back. "When will we get a white line?! I drive on Eaton Avenue every day to get to work and there are over 40 cars parked in an area designated by a white line. You say that the line doesn't deter speeding, but I haven't seen any crashed cars!" Another gentleman spoke up. "I think it is horrible that these people have to come here and beg for something as simple as traffic safety."

I went home that night feeling satisfied that I spoke my mind but unsure I would receive my white line. Then, on one bright summer day as I was walking to my car to come to work I noticed some city workers.



I called Patience and we both ran over to them. "Are you two measuring the street for a white line?"

"As a matter of fact we are! I Was at the City Council meeting the night you were there making your request. Job should be done by the end of the week weather permitting!" They were true to their word. Five days later:



VOILA! Our long-awaited white line has become a reality! My neighbors have noticed that people are driving calmer, following the speed limit, are not "hugging the curb," and we are feeling safer in our neighborhood.

While this is a fun story to tell you I do have a reason. In the U.C.C. Statement of Faith we petition God to give us "Courage in the struggle of justice and peace." As Christians it is not always easy to stand up for what we know to be true and right. Now God calls us to stand up for far more than white lines on roads to promote safety, considering that it took us 8 years to get the "justice" we sought.

As Christians, when we see homelessness, we fight to eliminate it. When we see hatred, we sow seeds of peace. When we see hunger, we offer food. When we see children without school supplies or decent clothing for a harsh winter, we provide it.

It took us 8 years to get our justice. Resolving homelessness, hunger, malnutrition, and illness are issues that will require a lifetime of work and it is easy to get tired and frustrated and wonder if we are making any progress at all. That is when we pray for courage. Perusing justice and peace is a struggle but one that can be achieved. Justice and peace are winning one day at a time. Don't take on more than that otherwise you will be discouraged. What justice and peace have you achieved this day? Tomorrow will present more challenges. Celebrate the accomplishments of today before you deal with tomorrow.




Create a simple and meaningful prayer box your family can use to share requests and pray together all week long.

- Stickers and other craft material (optional)
- · Pens or pencils
- Index cards or small pieces of paper

What you do:

- 1. Wrap the shoebox like a gift, wrapping the lid separately so it can be opened.
- As a family, decorate the box with drawings, favorite Bible verses, photos, or stickers.
- Place the box somewhere central, like the kitchen or living room.
- Keep index cards and pens nearby.
 When someone has a prayer request, they can write or draw it and drop it in.
- Throughout the week, take turns praying over the requests as a family, or have a parent lead prayer time.
