Before moving away Joyce White was a faithful member of this church. She sang in the choir, served several terms as an elder, president of Consistory, and as the Church Treasurer. In gratitude for her service and the friendship we shared a contribution has been made to our Enduring Gifts Fund in her memory. Steve and Janet

Mitchel were founding members of this church. Having moved far away in their retirement, they may have become forgotten by some and unknown by others but they remained committed to Faith United Church of Christ. Through their generous gift to our Enduring Gifts Fund, the ministry of Faith Church will continue to speak for justice, witness to love and kindness, and spread the word of the Gospel in our generation and those to come.

Bob Pierson moved to Florida after he retired. Later he returned to Coopersburg to be close to family and then moved to Atria Assisted Living in Bethlehem. Bob loved this church and was always very concerned about its financial stability. It is only fitting that Memorial Gifts received in his name were invested in the Enduring Gifts Fund to provide resources for the church's future.

People: We are grateful for Kenny's generosity and dedication to this church. We were blessed to have him in our midst during his earthly life. May this display remind us of the gift of his life to us and encourage to share with others as he did with us. And may the monetary gift entrusted to the work of the Mission Team be a silent yet tangible witness to vulnerable children in need of God's love.

Pastor: Marilyn Bleam gave so much of herself to the ministry of the church. Trying to list her contributions is very difficult but many were done quietly and without notice. She served as the church's first secretary and held that position for 20 years. She sang in the choir. She even mowed the grass on those hot summer days. After she and her husband Frank moved to Florida upon retirement,

Marilyn volunteered in the office of the church that they called home.

Today we dedicate a cross built in her memory. During the Lenten Season it is placed in a more prominent location in the sanctuary to remind us of Jesus journey to Jerusalem and ultimately to the cross. But on Easter Sunday its dull brown wood is flooded with the bright color of lilies to remind that the power of Jesus cannot be contained. Jesus returned to life and He lives with us even now.

People: We thank you for Marilyn's life and all that she shared with us and did for your glory. May this cross remind us of the sacrifice that Christ made that we might be forgiven of our sins and enjoy newness of life. May the cross remind us that we too must journey to Jerusalem with Jesus.
